

University of South Carolina Tenure-Track Faculty Positions

The Department of Health Services Policy and Management, Arnold School of Public Health, University of South Carolina seeks qualified candidates for up to three tenure-track faculty positions (open rank) for the academic year 2012-13.

The Department offers a Master of Public Health degree, a Master of Health Administration degree (accredited by the Commission on Healthcare Management Education), as well as PhD and Doctor of Public Health degrees in Health Services Policy and Management.

Qualifications: A promising record in original research, a commitment to quality teaching, and a doctorate in health services research, health policy, health care administration/management, health information systems, health economics or a related field are required. Experience in teaching is preferred. Evidence of ability or promise to obtain external funding is required. Applicants for senior faculty positions must demonstrate excellence in scholarship, teaching and extramural funding.

Responsibilities: Develop a funded research program and collaborate with colleagues. Teach undergraduate and graduate courses. Advise and mentor students and fellows. Perform service to the University, profession, and community.

Salary: Commensurate with experience.
